School Updates with Principal Dr. Carey

- Each day is feeling more "pre-pandemic" and March 7 was another layer of concern, but great to share smiles in the classrooms and halls
- The Friday before the mask requirement was lifted, Dr Carey shared an announcement was made to all students and the importance of respecting everyone's choice to wear masks, staff and students.
- Will continue to social distance (3 feet or more) where possible in the school
- Discussed the water fountains and utilize the bottle filling stations and keep assigned seats in the lunchroom
- Upcoming activities:
 - Shark Tank, where students can embrace a theme, develop a tri-fold display and prototype, they will develop a pitch. There are judges and top winners are announced (after school hours)
 - Drama production in the works, Orange is the New Black (more from Ms. Banas below)
 - Talent/Variety show in early May.
 - End of year carnival June 15, rain date June 16.
 - Forest Lodge, running into some issues securing transportation. Final decision on if this event will take place will be coming shortly from Dr. Carey.
- Academic updates:
 - NJ-SLA testing in early May, May 2 through May 10 generally morning hours, with a rotation of class periods in the afternoon. More details coming out soon.
 - 5th grade orientation in late April. They will also make a visit to Auten Road during the school day for an hour and a half for a tour of the building on various dates in May.

- lowa testing for sixth graders, which is an objective way to assess students' algebra readiness ahead of middle school, took place in early February. When will results/placements be shared? Each test is hand scored, so it may take a few more weeks before placement recommendations are available.

Updates from our ARIS Teacher(s)

Ms. Jessica Banas (Special Ed), 2022 Teacher of the Year

- o Students coming in on Monday seemed split with students wearing or not wearing masks. Today/Tuesday all was back to normal and everyone is being very respectful to each other and their choices.
- o Ms. Banas is one of five advisors of the ARIS Drama Club. The students have been practicing since June. Over 200 students were interested in being involved with the stage crew, which will start meeting next week to create, paint and move sets, work on lighting, makeup, costumes. Will hang posters in the school to encourage students to attend.
- o The team is very excited to bring a production of *Orange is the New Black* to school Friday, April 22. Doors open 6:30 p.m., show starts at 7 p.m.
- o Free for students, and may charge parents a small amount to raise money for props and equipment for shows in the future.
- o Runtime: Assume 45 minutes, intermission, then 30 minutes.
- More to come as details get ironed out on how tickets will be distributed and sold to parents/adults.
- o Pie to the eye fundraiser last month raised a lot of money. The most \$ Auten raised in its 20 years.

- o Book Fair (in person March 21 to March 24; online March 18 31)
 - Our first in school event!!! Scholastic Book Fair will take place during school hours in the library.
 - We want to avoid managing cash, especially during the school day.
